Pursuit Racing on Lake Michigan?

Are you interested in racing your sailboat, but don't like the idea of several boats trying to squeeze in on a tight starting line? Don't like the fast pace of racing around the buoys? Work too late, or too far from the yacht Club to make the Wednesday night series? Have problems finding enough crew? Well, Racine Yacht Club may have the answer for you.

If you are an east coast sailor you may be familiar with pursuit racing, but around the Great Lakes, you don't hear that term very often. Racine Yacht Club has a weekend pursuit series that runs one race a month during the racing season. We alternate between Saturday and Sunday and plan the course based on a two to four hour duration. So, what is pursuit racing, and what makes it so different?

In a pursuit race, we get rid of that crowded start line. As a matter of fact we even get rid of the race committee boat and the race committee. We take PHRF racing and turn it on its head. Instead of calculating a corrected time after the finish of the race to see who wins, we correct that time at the start of the race.

We set the course distance and then use your PHRF Time on Distance rating to calculate your corrected time, based on the scratch boat. That corrected time is then used to give you a head start. The slowest boat(s) start first. If you are the only boat with that PHRF rating, you start all by yourself. The rest of the fleet then progressively starts their race based on their PHRF rating, until the scratch boat finally starts last. This is where the pursuit comes in. Every boat is now

pursuing the leader, because in this race, first to finish wins!

But seriously, even if those reasons listed above haven't stopped you from racing, maybe adding the pursuit series to your racing schedule could still benefit you and or your crew. This is a great way to get the crew out and practice. It's a great way to hone your trimming and driving skills, because nobody has in the back of their mind that our rating should help us win. It's also great for the shorthanded sailing community. It alleviates the need for the large crew required to get around the buoys. It takes that long distance racing and brings it

down in scale a bit for a great way to practice. And lastly, it's a great way to introduce your friends and family to sailboat racing without the pressures of fast paced buoy racing or the long grueling distance race.


